# Ordinance Establishing Budget Authorization Fiscal Year Beginning July 1, 2020

#### **BE IT ORDAINED:**

**SECTION I:** The Budget Officer is hereby authorized to transfer appropriations as contained herein under the following conditions:

- A. He/she may transfer amounts between line item expenditures within a department without a report being required. These changes should not result in increases in recurring obligations such as salaries.
- B. He/she may transfer amounts up to \$3,000 between departments, including contingency appropriations, within the same fund. He/she must make an official report on such transfers at the next regular meeting of the Governing Board.
- C. He/she may NOT transfer any amounts between funds, except as approved by the Governing Board in the Budget Ordinance as amended.

**SECTION II:** The Budget Officer may make cash advances between funds for periods not to exceed 60 days without reporting to the Governing Board. Any advances that extend beyond 60 days must be approved by the Governing Board.

**SECTION III**. Copies of this Budget Ordinance shall be furnished to the Clerk to the Governing Board, Budget Officer and Finance Officer to be kept on file by them for their direction in the disbursement of funds.
