CALL TO ORDER & INVOCATION

ORDINANCE NO. (2021) 21-01UDO

City Council City of Northwest, North Carolina Date: July 27, 2021

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NORTHWEST TO AMEND THE NORTHWEST UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the Northwest Unified Development Ordinance needs to be updated to meet requirements of North Carolina General Statutes Chapter 160D; and

WHEREAS, the Northwest Unified Development Ordinance needs to establish clear standards in residential areas for model homes, real estate sales centers, and neighborhood sales homes; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board recommended the amendments of the Northwest Unified Development Ordinance at the June 8, 2021 meeting.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Northwest, North Carolina, doth ordain:

- 1. That the Northwest Unified Development Ordinance is hereby amended consistent with the items recommended by the Planning Board and consistent with the amendments presented to and approved by the City Council.
- 2. All Ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict;
- 3. This Ordinance is adopted in the interest of public health, safety, and general welfare of the inhabitants of the City of Northwest, North Carolina, and shall be in effect on July 28th, 2021.

This Ordinance adopted this 27th day of July 2021.

B. Park Playground Equipment

Donna Strickland, City Clerk, stated that John Barrs with Barrs Recreation came to look at our swing set chains. He showed where the playground equipment was not safe (photos will be placed in Exhibit Book V). Mrs. Strickland stated that she had looked at some playground catalogs and it appeared that a minimum cost of at least \$14,000 would be necessary to begin replacing the playground equipment. She also stated that cost would be for equipment only, no mulch.

Councilman Perkins stated that if you can get playground equipment for \$14,000, it would it great. The equipment at the County Parks range from over \$100,000 upwards to \$250,000.

Councilwoman Sheila Grady **MOVED**, **SECONDED** by Councilman Charles Carroll to approve Budget Amendment 3 for the purchase of playground equipment.

Councilman Miller asked if we need to increase the amount? Councilman Aaron Perkins stated that the \$14,000 would be a good starting point and if we needed to appropriate more, we could do another budget amendment.

• Concession Roof & Ceiling Repair Update

• Park Shelter Roof Repair Update

• Handicap Ramp Repair

Councilman Aaron Perkins stated that we are waiting to determine if the handicap ramp can be moved to the front.

After discussion,

It was the **CONSENSUS** of Council to have the Clerk find out if the City has been connected to the sewer system.

• Front Porch Repair

Councilman Aaron Perkins stated that, as soon as it can be determined whether the City is connected to sewer, the handicap ramp can be moved to the front and the front porch can be repaired.

• Back Porch vs Back Deck

This item will be determined by where the handicamp ramp is located.

• City Sign at City Hall

Councilman Aaron Perkins stated he is waiting to get a copy of our City Seal to send to the sign shop and once that is done, he will get a quote.
