# A. FEMA FLOOD INSURANCE STUDY & FLOOD INSURANCE RATE MAPS PRESENTATION BY JOHN SHIRK – FLOOD PLAIN ADMINISTRATOR

To remain in good standing with FEMA and the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), the City of Northwest is required to adopt the FEMA Flood Insurance Study and associated Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) a new Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance should be adopted by December 6<sup>,</sup> 2019. Periodically, Flood Insurance Studies and Flood Insurance Rate Maps as well as requirements for Flood Damage Prevention Ordinances are updated and municipalities must adhere to these changes to remain in good standing. The last Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance for the City of Northwest was adopted in June of 2006. On November 4, 2019, a contract with Brunswick County received final approval for the administration of floodplain management. John Shirk, will be responsible for administering the proposed Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance. The proposed Ordinance will be housed within Article 7 of the recently adopted Northwest Unified Development Ordinance and includes autoadoption language to automatically adopt future map panels and insurance studies after January 1st of 2020. On October 8, 2019, the Northwest Planning Board recommended adoption of the FEMA Flood Insurance Study and associated Flood Insurance Rate Maps. At this time, there was no consistency statement adopted with the recommendation. On November 12, the Planning Board adopted a consistency statement for the previously recommended adoption of the FEMA Flood Insurance Study and Flood Insurance Rate Maps.

The Planning Board recommends adoption and finds that the proposed adoption of the FEMA Flood Insurance Study and Flood Insurance rate Maps is consistent with the comprehensive plan's goal of natural hazard reduction by conserving and maintaining flood plains for their natural storm protection. The Planning Board also finds that the proposed

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adoption is reasonable and in the public interest because it will promote public health, safety, and general welfare in the community by establishing provisions to minimize public and private losses due to flood conditions within flood prone areas. This action will allow Northwest to remain in good standing with the National Flood Insurance Program.

The City of Northwest held three public informational meetings. The purpose of the meetings was to provide as much information as possible to the City's utility customers about Brunswick County Public Utilities providing water & sewer services within the City of Northwest, beginning January 1, 2020.

Brunswick County has paid off the USDA Loan as of 11/22/2019.

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The City's Duke Power and AT&T bills at our lift & pump station are being switched to Brunswick County Utilities.

The City's staff has been working with Brunswick County, to make sure we have a smooth transition.

The City of Northwest will do their last reading on December 31, 2019. Those bills will be due on January 20, 2020. The payments collected for this billing will be paid to Brunswick County.
